Justification: Deputy Commander of the Basij, former Head of the IRGC's Seyyed al-Shohada Corps, Tehran Province (until FebruaryFeb 2010). The Seyyed al-Shohada Corps is in charge of security in Tehran province and played a key role <u>under his responsibility</u> in brutal repression of protesters in 2009. **Modifications:** Amended on 18 May 2016

SSID: 80-13100 **Foreign identifier:** 8. **Name:** Motlagh Bahram Hosseini **Justification:** <u>Head of the Army Command and General Staff College (DAFOOS). Former Head of the IRGC's Seyyed al-Shohada Corps, Tehran Province. The Under his responsibility, the Seyyed al-Shohada Corps played a key role in organising the repression of protests. **Modifications:** Amended on 18 May 2016</u>

As Deputy Chief of National Police since from 2008, Radan was responsible for beatings, murder, and arbitrary arrests and detentions against protestors that were committed by the police forces. Trials under his supervision have been conducted summarily and inside closed sessions, without adherence to basic rights of the accused, and with reliance on confessions extracted under pressure and torture. As execution rulings were issued en masse, death sentences were issued without proper observance of fair hearing procedures. **Modifications:** Amended on 12 May 2015, 18 May 2016

He has been instrumental in issuing detention orders to the Kahrizak Detention Centre. In Nov 2014, his role in the deaths of detainees was officially recognised by the Iranian authorities. **Modifications:** Amended on 12 May 2015, 18 May 2016

Former Judge, Mashhad Revolutionary Court. Trials under his jurisdiction have been conducted summarily and inside closed session, without adherence to basic rights of the accused. As execution rulings were issued en masse, death sentences were issued without proper observance of fair hearing procedures. **Modifications**: Amended on 18 May 2016

Justification: Former Judge, Tehran Revolutionary Court, branch 26. <u>Likely to be currently in a process of reassignment to another function.</u> He <u>iswas</u> in charge of post-election cases, he issued long prison sentences during unfair trials against human rights activists and has issued several death sentences for protesters. **Modifications:** Amended on 12 May 2015, 18 May 2016

Justification: Deputy Head of the Unit for Social Affairs and Crime Prevention at the judiciary in the province of Khorasan-Razavi. Former Deputy Prosecutor of Mashhad. Trials under his prosecution have been conducted summarily and inside closed session, without adherence to basic rights of the accused. As execution rulings were issued en masse, death sentences were issued without proper observance of fair hearing procedures.

Justification: Judge at the Supreme Court. Former Head of East Azerbaidjan Judiciary. He

Justification: Director-General of Iran's <u>Drug Control Headquarters (a.k.a.</u> Anti-Narcotics Headquarters-<u>)</u>. Former Commander of Tehran Police. Under his leadership, the police force was responsible for <u>the</u> use of extrajudicial force on suspects during arrest and pre-trial

detention. The Tehran police were <u>also</u> implicated in raids on Tehran university dorms in Jun 2009, when according to an Iranian Majlis commission, more than 100 students were injured by the police and Basiji. **Modifications:** Amended on 12 May 2015, 18 May 2016

Justification: Former Deputy Prosecutor of Isfahan. Likely to be currently in a process of reassignment to another function. Complicit in proceedings denying defendants a fair trial – such as Abdollah Fathi executed in May 2011 after his right to be heard and mental health issues were ignored by Habibi during his trial in Mar 2010. He is, therefore, complicit in a grave violation of the right to due process, contributing to the excessive and increasing use of the death penalty and a sharp increase in executions since the beginning of 2011.

He was one of the first high rankinghigh-ranking officials to ask fordemand Moussavi, Karroubi and Khatami's arrest. He has repeatedly supported the use of violence and harsh interrogation tactics against post-election protesters (justifying TV-recorded confessions), including instructing ordering the extrajudicial maltreatment of dissidents through publications circulated to the IRGC and Basij. Justification: Head of the Intelligence Services within the Iranian Police. Former Head of the Computer Crimes Unit of the Iranian Police. He is responsible for thousands of investigations and indictments of reformists and political opponents using the Internet. He is thus responsible for directing grave human rights violations in the repression of persons who speak upout in defence of their legitimate rights, including freedom of expression.

Justification: Deputy General Attorney, responsible for political and security issues Official of the Special Clerical Tribunal. Former Minister of Justice from 2009 to 2013. During his time as Minister of Justice, prison conditions within Iran fell well below accepted international standards, and there was widespread mistreatment of prisoners. In addition, he played a key role in threatening and harassing the Iranian diaspora by announcing the establishment of a special court to deal specifically with Iranians who live outside of the country. He also oversaw a sharp increase in the number of executions in Iran, including secret executions not announced by the government, and executions for drug-related offenses offences.

Under his leadership, the Ministry of Intelligence continued the practices of widespread arbitrary detention and persecution of protestors and dissidents. The Ministry of Intelligence runs Ward 209 of Evin Prison, where many activists have been held on account of their peaceful activities in opposition to the government in power. Interrogators from the Ministry of Intelligence have subjected prisoners in Ward 209 to beatings and mental and sexual abuse. **Modifications:** Amended on 12 May 2015, 18 May 2016

Under his tenure at IRIB, he was responsible for all programming decisions. IRIB has broadcast forced confessions of detainees and a series of «show trials» in Aug 2009 and Dec 2011. Justification: Member of the Supreme Cyberspace Council. Member of the City Council of Tehran. Former Minister for Information and Communications (2009-2012). As Minister for Information, he was one of the top officials in charge of censorship and control of internet activities and also all types of communications (in particular mobile phones). During interrogations of political detainees, the interrogators make use of the detainees' personal data, mail and communications. On several occasions following the 2009 presidential election and during street demonstrations, mobile lines and text messaging were blocked, satellite TV channels were jammed and the internet locally suspended or at least slowed down. **Modifications:** Amended on 12 May 2015, 18 May 2016

Justification: Colonel Chief of the technology and communications police EU-designated Center to Investigate Organized Crime (a.k.a.: Cyber Crime Office or Cyber Police). In this capacity, he announced a campaign for the recruitment of government hackers in order to achieve better control of information on the internet and attack «dangerous» sites.

Later appointed as Head of the Iranian Election Committee for the parliamentarian elections in 2012 and for the presidential elections in 2013. **Modifications:** Amended on 12 May 2015, 18 May 2016

Justification: Prosecutor of Karaj. Responsible for grave violations of human rights, including prosecuting trials in which the death penalty is passed. There have been a high

number of executions in Karaj region during his time as prosecutor prosecutor for which he bears responsibility. **Modifications:** Amended on 12 May 2015, 18 May 2016
